




Substance Use Presentation

The YHCC approached health and other community health groups to gather information/pamphlets re: menstrual health to be provided to students at the event and also volunteered the use of the YHC as a physical space. The Red Door in Kentville also donated some menstrual cups that were given away at the event to students wishing to try one. Our SP Mental Health Clinician also joined us on the day to help students participate in three activities/games – Trivia in the HHS lobby, a 'Price is Right' style game guessing the prices of various menstrual products in the SP space, and a stigma-reduction brainstorm exercise around period slang in the YHCC.
