#### Fall Drop-in/SchoolsPlus Rooms





WHAT: Both Kings West and Horton Schools, hosted a great drop-in in program this Fall, to support students. Although activities varied from each site, a range of board games, crafts, and snacks were available. Crochet and crochet and career happened at KW, while Horton had a special one-off weekly activity (Spaghetti Tower Challenge, Candy Guess, "Mystery Soda" Guess-the-Flavor, and a Get-To-Know-You game encouraging students to connect with folks they had not met before), and a Junior leader (older students) provided support.


